Professional Experience

Wen-Qing Li, is the Deputy Director and Professor of the Center for Clinical Epidemiology, Peking University Cancer Hospital, and a PI of the State Key Laboratory of Holistic Integrative Management of Gastrointestinal Cancers in China, and an adjunct associate professor of Brown University. Dr. Li obtained his Ph.D. degree from Peking University in 2010 and received postdoctoral training at Harvard Medical School and National Cancer Institute in the U.S.. He then joined Brown University as an assistant professor in 2014. Dr. Li's area of expertise is in cancer epidemiology and cancer prevention, focusing on risk assessment, precise prevention, and control of gastric cancer as the main line of his research, and has authored over 200 publications, including over 130 in SCI-indexed journals. He is an awardee of the National Youth Award of China, Young Cancer Scientist Award of China, and Distinguished Youth Talent Award of Beijing. He is a deputy to the National Congress of Chinese Society of Science and Technology and serves as a council member of the Chinese Anti-Cancer Association (CACA). He is also the Vice President and General Secretary of Youth Council of the Beijing Anti-Cancer Association and the standing committee member for several national committees of CACA.
